APPLICATION FOR ARIZONA CENTENNIAL 2012 LEGACY PROJECT DESIGNATION

1. General Description. The Arizona Centennial Quilt Project provides an opportunity for quilters and the general public to celebrate Arizona's centennial through various hands-on and educational opportunities that center on the place that quilts and quilt making holds in our shared Arizona heritage.

2. Meeting Legacy Project Criteria. The Arizona Centennial Quilt Project contains various elements which may include:

- a competition to design or select an Arizona Centennial commemorative fabric
- a quilt challenge, allowing quilters across Arizona to create a quilt that marks the Centennial
- the creation, by the Arizona quilting community, of a quilt depicting scenes from Arizona history
- traveling exhibition of selected challenge quilts that will tour state and national quilt shows and museums

We believe that the Arizona Centennial Quilt Project meets Legacy Project criteria. First, the large commemorative quilt project is envisioned to depict Arizona in its early days, Arizona at the point that Statehood was achieved and Arizona in the present day. This quilt, after touring the state and country, will be presented to an appropriate museum for preservation and future display. This large quilt project will accurately portray significant points in Arizona history.

Second, elements from the Arizona Centennial Quilt Project will be accessible worldwide via the website and quilt shows. There are two large Arizona-based quilt shows each year, one in Phoenix and one in Tucson. The shows experience as many as 6,000 visitors over their three day runs. Add to these the smaller regional shows and possible exposure in national venues and the number of exposures grows exponentially.

Third, the project will demonstrate collaboration among quilting groups across the state. The Arizona Centennial Quilt Project grew out of the Arizona Quilt History Study Group, a statewide group of quilt-interested individuals who come together on a regular basis to study historically significant quilts. The Arizona Centennial Quilt Project, seeking the advantages of having a 501 (c) (3) designation to support the Project, sought partnership with the Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame, a statewide, nonprofit organization with a mission of celebrating the contribution of Arizonans to quilt making and educating the public about quilt making, its history, and artisans, agreed to take the Centennial Project under its umbrella. The project will function with a committee comprised of leaders from all geographic areas of Arizona.

We believe the public will be educated about Arizona history in viewing the quilt shows and exhibits planned as part of this project. The website will also include educational components available to teachers.

Fourth, will be an Arizona Centennial Quilt publication. It will include the Arizona commemorative quilt and the juried challenge quilts celebrating diverse elements of Arizona history, people and places. It will also include a review of Arizona quilt history based on the Arizona Quilt Project book, Grand Endeavors. This book will endure beyond the project itself and become a resource for quilt historians beyond Arizona.

Fifth, we are early in the planning of our project and have already developed a timeline for implementation of the various pieces of the project.

3. Project Timeline

Present through 2010

- initiate state-wide publicity for project
- develop funding streams and sponsorships for various elements of the project
- develop and produce marketing materials i.e. logo, brochures, web site, trade show display elements
- establish competition rules
- design and produce Arizona Centennial commemorative fabric, pre-selling to Arizona quilt shops
- publicize competition to design Arizona Centennial quilt pattern
- complete design of commemorative quilt
- host quilt documentation days

2011

- publicize, challenge and distribute entry forms
- commence sale of commemorative fabric and quilt pattern
- finalize quilt documentation days
- schedule various work days for completion of commemorative quilt
- October - deadline for entry in quilt competition
- December - announce winners of quilt competition
- Publication enters writing/production stage

2012

- first public showing of commemorative quilt and challenge quilts
- Selected challenge quilts and commemorative quilt travel to shows around the state/country from February 2012 to February 2013
- sale of commemorative quilt patterns continues

2013

- Commemorative quilt is presented and installed in a selected Arizona museum or other public venue
- Second book of documented quilts available to the public
- Project concludes.

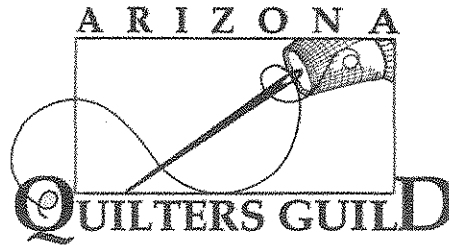
